My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope you and your families are well as we move closer to Spring and the promise of new life! Next weekend, with the visit to us by Mary's Meals, we will have the opportunity to be givers of life in a very practical and important way. As I mentioned to you in a recent Newsletter, we have been asked to sponsor Namichenja Primary School, in the Sinda District of Zambia, for one more year; it has a roll of 302 pupils, 134 boys and 168 girls. Mary's Meals believes in the power of a nourishing meal; 20 years' experience has shown that a daily school meal has hugely positive and long-term improvements to a child's life. Through our involvement, we are helping to break the cycle of poverty by ensuring the children gain an education, setting them up for a brighter future with better employment prospects. We are giving them a chance at Life! It costs £19.50 to provide a school meal for one year. Astonishing, but true! As we know well from the past, a little donation from us all goes a very long way. St. Teresa of Calcutta was fond of saying to her Sisters, 'Let's do something beautiful for God,' *In that same Spirit, let us do something beautiful for the children in Namichenja Primary School.*


