My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope this finds you and your families well as we move through the challenges of the winter. On Monday evening we will welcome local members of the St. Vincent de Paul for Mass at 7pm. Even though much fewer in number than in previous times, the SVDP continues to reach out to those facing challenging times and tries to be a support in all sorts of ways, financially, practically and socially. A good example of this is their furniture programme, through which they provide much needed support in a very practical way. This will be our parish Mass on Monday and, if you are free, please join us at 7pm. Our welcome and our presence will be a good support to those who continue to give generously of their time to others.

On Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, a special moment for us as a parish. Mass will be celebrated in St. Paul's Primary School at 9.30am; even though our church building in Whitehill has now closed, the life and ministry of the church continues as we look for new ways of being *church*. By any standards, St. Paul made a remarkable human journey, from persecuting people for following the way of Jesus to becoming the great herald of the gospel to the nations and the servant of all. It was a remarkable change of heart brought about by his encounter with the risen Christ on the road to Damascus. I will anticipate this feast at St. Mary's on Tuesday morning at 10am; please join us as we seek to come to know and love St. Paul, our patron, more deeply.

On Tuesday of last week I attended an assembly of the Clergy with Bishop Toal, who invited every parish to participate in a pastoral initiative called, **Project Wellspring**, which will be initiated by the diocese in February. As members of the church we will be invited to *renew* our witness to the great commission, *go make disciples of all nations (Mt 28:19)*, to ensure that all people are welcome in our churches and are heard, respected and recognised, and to enable young people to live and share their own love for the Gospel. This pastoral project will encourage us to keep looking beyond our church buildings, *to share the joys and hopes, the grief and anxieties of all, especially the poor, bringing the healing love of Jesus Christ to all.*

I mention this here to keep you informed and to invite you to pray for the success of this pastoral initiative in our Diocese of Motherwell. *Father O'Brien*
