My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope this finds you and your families well as our Lenten pilgrimage reaches the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Sincere thanks for the great generosity to the SCIAF appeal. It's true that a little donation from us all goes a long way; our collection raised £3,000 to support SCIAF's pastoral projects in Rwanda. I offer the following words from Pope Benedict on this Sunday's Gospel:

"In the immanence of his Passion Jesus declared: 'Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit'. Now is no longer the time for words and discourses; indeed the crucial hour has come for which the Son of God came into the world and although his soul is troubled, he makes himself available to fulfil the Father's will to the end. And this is the will of God: to give eternal life to us who have lost it. However, in order for this to be brought about Jesus dies, like a grain of wheat that God the Father has sown in the world. Indeed, only in this way can a new humanity germinate and grow, free from the dominion of sin and able to live in brotherhood, as sons and daughters of the one Father who is in heaven."
