This Sunday is a very moving one for us as the parish community of St. Mary's and St. Paul's Hamilton. It will see us gather together in St. Paul's Church for our special **Mass of Thanksgiving** for all the graces and blessings received from this much loved church since it opened its doors in 1955. Damian Murphy and of course the people they served in the Whitehill area of Hamilton. We have so much to say 'thank you' for.

The next stage of our journey together as St. Mary's and St. Paul's Parish will see us continue as the one parish, but with only one church building, and that will be the venerable old house of prayer that we know and love as St. Mary's Hamilton, the mother church of the whole of South Lanarkshire. This will be our common spiritual home, where we will gather now as a parish community to celebrate the eucharist together. Let us open wide the doors of St. Mary's and our own hearts in warm welcome to our friends and neighbours from St. Paul's.

It is clear that the 21st century has its own particular challenges for us as Christians, especially the movement away from regular practise of the Christian faith. Participating in the Synod on Synodality in the Diocese of Motherwell: as well as praying for the success of the Synod throughout the month of October in our parishes and communities, we will do so as a Diocese, led by Bishop Toal, at a special gathering for prayer and reflection on Thursday 19th October between 7 and 9pm in the Xavier Centre, Carfin. Delegates from each parish are invited, but anyone else who would like to attend is most welcome. Parish Priests will nominate 3 representatives from their parish.

At this gathering, time will be spent in prayer followed by discussion and discernment on the three questions presented in the Working Document for the Synod.

The three questions are:

How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of God and the unity of all humankind?

How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?

What processes, structures and institutions are needed in a Missionary Synodal Church?

Prayer booklets and cards have also been printed so that the whole People of God can make intercession for the success of the Synod.

Next Sunday is Mission Sunday: there will be a second collection next week in parishes across Scotland to support Missio, the Pope's Official Mission Charity; this year we will be supporting our brothers and sisters in Sri Lanka. *In these challenging times please feel free to keep your offertory donation for the second collection*

The Parish Walking Group meets every Tuesday at 11am at the Museum on Muir Street. Those gathered walk for around 1 hour and then enjoy some refreshments together in the Museum café. *New walkers are always welcome.*
