St. Mary and St. Paul's Befriending Group: the parish pastoral council is responding to a suggestion that was made about establishing a *Befriending Group* within our parish community. A few people have shown interest in taking this pastoral project forward and will meet on **Tuesday 30**th **September at 7pm in the parish meeting room.** If you are interested in finding out more about what membership of a *Befriending Group* involves, then please come along to the meeting this Tuesday evening.

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) has been established as the means by which a person can explore the faith of the Catholic Church. Over a period of months, the RCIA offers a way to grow in knowledge of Jesus and the Catholic Faith, in the company of others. The RCIA takes place within a parish community so that the participants can share in the life of the church expressed in a local parish.

In the spirit of sharing what we ourselves have been freely given, we seek to offer the RCIA to those who are thinking about becoming a member of the Catholic Church. At present five people have expressed an interest in making this journey; there is still time for others to come forward. We will begin on October 23rd at 7pm-8.30pm, meeting once in the week, and receiving people into the Church at the Easter Vigil in 2026. *Please speak with Fr. O'Brien if you are interested in becoming a member of the church*.


