Fourth Sunday of Easter

April 21st 2024

My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope you and your families are well as we reach the Fourth Sunday of Easter, what is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations. I offer some words from Pope St. John Paul II for your reflection:

"I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." How can we fail to see in these words an implicit reference to the mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection? "I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord, and I have power to take it up again (Jn 10:17-18.)". Christ freely offered himself on the Cross and rose by virtue of his own divine power. Therefore the allegory of the Good Shepherd has a strongly paschal character and for this reason the church proposes it for our reflection during this Easter season. Christ's pastoral mission is a universal mission that is not limited to the sons and daughters of Israel, but by virtue of his sacrifice on the cross, embraces all men and women and all peoples."

The Children's Liturgy is an important part of our parish outreach to our young parishioners, a way for us to be Good Shepherds to them: the liturgy group will meet this Sunday after the 10.30am Mass. Anyone interested in joining the group as a helper is welcome to come along; the Children's Liturgy offers a simpler version of the Gospel and a little discussion or activities designed to enhance the key message of that Sunday's liturgy. It helps children to form their own relationship with Jesus and his gospel; it is a beautiful gift to give our children and they deserve this from us. It is currently provided for children at (or about to start) primary school and who are able to attend and participate independently.

CREDO: our parish faith-sharing group meets this Tuesday at 1 o'clock in the parish meeting room; we pray and read the Scriptures of the day and discuss what they mean to us, our own lives and our personal relationship with God; a passage from Bible Alive for that day summarises the readings. Participants are welcome to sit and simply listen; no one is asked to speak unless they wish to do so. The meeting lasts until 2.30pm when we then enjoy some tea and biscuits together.
