My dear parishioners,

An Easter Reflection by Pope Benedict XVI

"We know that Christ has truly risen from the dead. Yes, indeed! This is the fundamental core of our profession of faith; this is the cry of victory that unites us all today. And if Jesus is risen, and is therefore alive, who will ever be able to separate us from him? Who will ever be able to deprive us of the love of him who has conquered hatred and overcome death? Let us sing it with our lips, and let us sing it above all with our hearts and our lives, with a manner of life that is 'unleavened', that is to say simple, humble and fruitful in good works.
