The Fifth Sunday of the Year

February 5th 2023

My dear parishioners,

I hope this finds you and your families well. Last Sunday we listened together to Matthew's account of the Sermon on the Mount, a passage known and loved by so many followers of Jesus. Immediately after his moving Sermon, Jesus describes his disciples as 'the salt of the earth' and 'the light of the world'. It is clear that Jesus believes in his disciples and of course that means he believes in us too, for we are his 21st century disciples. We could even say that Jesus is entrusting his mission to those who follow after him. In the mind and heart of Jesus it is a deep and lasting relationship, for we are to remain salty and we are to let our *light* go on shining brightly.

In quiet moments, we might wonder what this will mean in practical terms. This week's first reading from the prophet Isaiah provides a moving answer: "Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your kin, then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon."

I think we would agree that there are enough clenched fists in our world, fists that do real and lasting damage. As a parish community, let's take a moment to look at our hands and commit ourselves anew to using them in the ways Isaiah suggests. Father O'Brien
