Third Sunday of Easter

April 14th 2024

My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope you and your families are well and enjoying together the unfolding of Spring, as Nature wakes up from Winter's long sleep; Nature itself seems to be touched by the spirit of the Resurrection. Already we have reached the Third Sunday of Easter and I offer some words from Pope Benedict for your reflection:

"The Resurrection of Jesus is central to Christianity. It is a fundamental truth to be asserted vigorously in every epoch, since to deny it, as has been, and continues to be attempted, or to transform it into a purely spiritual event, is to thwart our very faith. St. Paul states: *'If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain'* (1Cor 15:14). In the days that followed the Lord's Resurrection, the Apostles stayed together, comforted by Mary's presence, and after the Ascension they persevered with her in prayerful expectation of Pentecost. Our Lady was a Mother and Teacher to them, a role that she continues to play for Christians of all times."
