Dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I want to say sincere thanks for the beautiful Mass of Thanksgiving we celebrated last Sunday morning to honour the river of grace that has flowed from St. Paul's Church, Whitehill, since it opened its doors in 1955. We filled the church to overflowing and we sang and prayed our way through the moving liturgy to mark the closure of our much loved building.

So many families and friends came to say 'Thank You' to St. Paul's for blessings received over the years. How good and strengthening it was to have Bishop Joseph presiding at the Eucharist and praying with us and for us. Even the weather was on our side, enabling us to gather outside after the liturgy to greet one another and indeed to comfort one another. I think the Mass of Thanksgiving will remain long in the memory of all who were present.

The next stage of our journey together as St. Mary's and St. Paul's Parish will see us continue as the one parish, but with only one church building, and that will be the venerable old house of prayer that we know and love as St. Mary's Hamilton, the mother church of the whole of South Lanarkshire. This will be our common spiritual home, where we will gather now as a parish community to celebrate the Eucharist together. Let us open wide the doors of St. Mary's and our own hearts in warm welcome to our friends and neighbours from St. Paul's.

It is clear that the 21st century has its own particular challenges for us as Christians, especially the movement away from regular practise of the Christian faith. It is important that we face these challenges as a community. The truth is we need one another very much. We often sing the popular hymn, "Bind us together Lord" and my deepest hope as your parish priest is that the Lord Jesus will bind us together with cords that cannot be broken. An Important Statement from Bishop Toal on 'Project Wellspring': I am pleased to announce we have very recently launched a new renewal project entitled *Wellspring* which seeks to equip the Diocese of Motherwell for growth over the next 10 years. The primary focus of this new project will be to renew and re-energise our missions by setting out a simple Gospel-centred vision and a fresh, new pastoral plan. It will also include a strategy for property and finance management.

We are already engaged in the early stages of planning with the clergy, supported by a small team of unpaid lay professionals who will mange the process with us. The discussion phases will very soon engage parishes and laity so that we can all contribute to the important work of preparing for the future. I expect to engage the entire diocesan community, young and old, as we move into 2024.

I am excited at the prospect of setting a new course as we look ahead with confidence to the next 10 years of mission in our diocese. Please pray that *Wellspring* will indeed be a great gift that renews and strengthens our bonds with the Lord and his Church. Pray too, that it inspires sisters and brothers who have distanced themselves to re-engage with the regular practice of the Catholic Faith. *May Our Lady of Good Aid, our Patroness and Mother, crown our work with her grace.*
