My dear parishioners at St. Mary's and St. Paul's,

I hope this finds you and your families all well as we move into February and we glimpse the lengthening of the evening light and the promise that Spring is drawing closer, with its abundant new life, when all again feels possible.

In recent weeks I have mentioned to you that Bishop Toal would like every parish to take part in a pastoral renewal project and by way of preparation the diocesan office sends this message:

'Wellspring' – This is a word we hope you will become familiar with. It is the title of our new diocesan renewal project which launches next week, on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is taken from the medieval 'Our Lady's Well', which gives its name to the town and diocese of Motherwell. The image of water and Our Lady is familiar to us from Lourdes, where Our Lady caused a spring of water to gush forth for St. Bernadette to wash and drink. In fact, over the years millions of pilgrims, young and old, have travelled to Lourdes to be spiritually refreshed and thankfully this continues to the present day.

Water is a symbol of the Lord's healing, forgiveness and life-giving power. Perhaps more importantly, 'Wellspring' invites us to think about our own baptism, that sacred moment when water was poured over our head and we were baptized into the life of the Blessed Trinity, the Mystery of Divine Love, and united to Christ, body and soul, in life and in death, in a bond that is steadfast; we also became a living member of the church, deeply united with all who belong to Christ, the living and the departed. This means our task in life is not to be in competition with others but rather to be in communion with them and indeed with the whole of creation. The waters of our baptism remain forever a Wellspring of grace. It's a beautiful image! This Wellspring lives within us, seeking to refresh and renew with the mystery of Christ and his gospel. We pray that through Wellspring our diocese will experience a new and abundant spring of living water.

The launch of Wellspring coincides with the beginning of Lent and I invite you to look forward to those special weeks by taking home the letter from SCIAF, containing your WEE BOX, which helps bring about a Big Change for some of the poorest people in our world. I invite you to see the wee box as sacred and to find a special place for it in your home. In doing so we are inviting some of the poorest people in our world into our home and into our lives and we too take a step into their lives. It's about communion and solidarity!

This years project focuses on the women and girls of Rwanda, who often have very difficult lives through gender-based violence; they are also less likely to receive an education, get a job, and earn money to meet their basic needs. *They are waiting on us. Let's not disappoint them!* Father O'Brien
