My dear parishioners,

I hope this finds you and your families well and enjoying the beginning of the beautiful season of Autumn. It will not be long until we hear the crunching of leaves underneath our feet.

On June 20th of this year, those who were able met together at St. Paul's to share how we are feeling about the prospect of our little church building closing its doors. Of course it is moving to share in this way because we listen to an outpouring of genuine concern for others: for the teachers and children at school next door, for the elderly and frail who still make great efforts to take their place at the eucharist, for those who laboured to build up the parish of St. Paul's in years past. It's no exaggeration to say it was often a moving expression of love and concern. In a very real sense, it is the church community at its very best, caring for one another.

At the end of the meeting I said I would get further reports carried out, especially of the church roof, boiler house and boiler, church windows and church house boiler. In light of these findings, and in light of the challenges facing the diocese in the near future regarding staffing and falling numbers at the liturgy, there is no doubt that we have moved to a new stage of our journey as the parish of St. Mary's and St. Paul's. What we do know for sure is that we can face the future together, for we have already travelled far since we came together in 2012.

I will be away for some days this coming week and so I suggest that we meet together at St. Paul's on Wednesday, September 27th at 6.30pm. I have invited Bishop Toal and Mr. Guy Logan, the Estates Manager of the Diocese, to join us. I hope, if you are free, you will meet with us there.

I have said to you before that a parish priest is never less alone than when alone, for he carries his people in his heart. So be assured that, in these days away for me, you will be very much in my thoughts and prayers. I know that you will be remembering me in your own good prayers,
